Key issues identified

- Society and politics struggle to move beyond the gender binary.
- Being misgendered, intentionally or not, creates daily distress. Many carefully choose when and where to come out.
- Gender equality programs usually focus on women and men, leaving non-binary people feeling unwelcome and invisible.
- Non-binary individuals are often the first non-binary person someone meets. Explaining their identity repeatedly is draining.



What participants expect

- Update laws and policies to recognise non-binary identities.
- Overhaul educational programs to include non-binary identities.
- Train teachers, researchers and policymakers on gender diversity.
- More solidarity among LGBTIQ+ and feminist organisations.
- Represent diverse experiences of non-binary people, e.g. non-binary elders, non-binary people of colour.
